Again, I remind you of the Allegheny Region Flea Market on May 26-27.

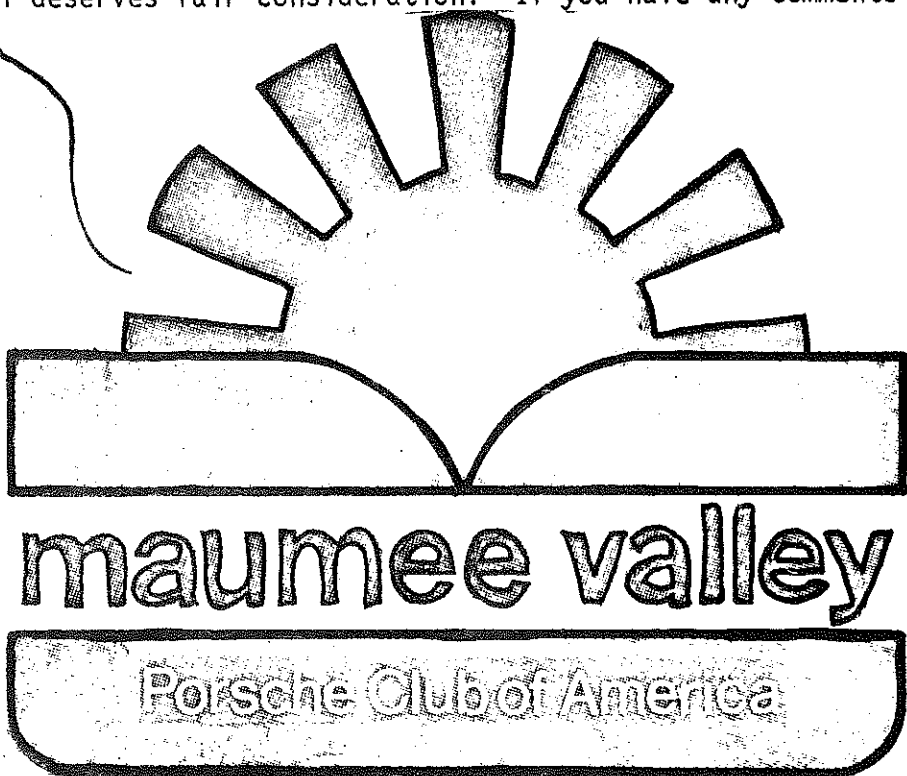

Car-train crash kills girl

A 17-year-old girl was killed in a car-train collision late Monday afternoon

on Jewett rd in southern Delaware County. Witnesses estimated the car was traveling between 10 and 15 miles per hour when struck by the work engine.

ENGINEER Robert C. Corder, 4590 Eileary-dr. told authorities the whistle on the train was blowing up to the time of impact.

SHE WAS identified as driver and only occupant of a small sports car which was struck by a Chesapeake and Ohio train at a crossing

Ohio State Highway Patrol investigators said the girl apparently did not hear the train approach.

IT WAS speculated the might have been listening to a car radio and failed to hear the train as it approached.

The train was traveling at 50 miles per hour it was reported

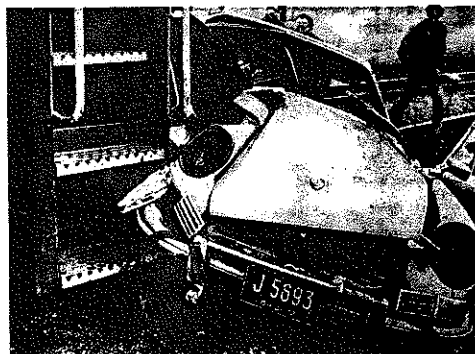
THE SMALL car was struck broadside and pushed about 1,300 feet down the track before the train could be stopped. The car was westbound

on Jewett. The train was southbound

AUTHORITIES said was believed the girl was enroute from her home riding stable

The train had been Carey and was returning Columbus

There are no warning lights at the crossing, a few miles south of Powell
