



Technical Q and A

2003 Boxster will, at times smoke when first started - 84,000 miles

Question: My 2003 base Boxster started smoking for a moment when I start the car the first time. IT does not do it every start and, when it does, it is only for the first second the car starts.

Answer: Submitted by Pedro Bonilla. Boxster smoking at startup generally means that a bit of oil has passed into one of the cylinders. Since these engines are flat, every now and then a droplet of oil can make it past the rings creating a large cloud of white smoke. If this happens sporadically (once or twice per year) it's normal. If it happens regularly then most likely the AOS (Air/Oil Separator) needs to be replaced. The AOS is a wear item that lasts 50K - 100K miles.

993 Engine Check Light - 1998 911 Carrera Cabriolet

Question: I have just joined PCA and know there has been much correspondence in the past regarding the dreaded CEL light. Every year I dread the smog test and spend money to get a mechanic to "turn off" the light for a few miles of relief only, during which I rush to the smog station. Many mechanics and dealers and dollars later I am so worn out by this cycle that I am even thinking of selling -- although I can't sell it with the CEL on! There has never been a problem showing with the diagnostics and they say there is nothing to fix. How do others deal with this in order to keep the light off and/or to sell their car? Help!

Answer: Submitted by Anthony Callas. WELCOME! Anytime there is an illuminated check engine light, there is an associated fault code(s). I usually perform a Controller Interrogation with a factory tester, this being with either the PST-2 (Porsche System Tester-2) or PIWIS-1 (Porsche Integrated Workshop Information System) for the 993's, retrieve the faults and follow a proper diagnostic routine for each fault. Sometimes faults can be related and/or from the same issue so careful examination is needed to determine exactly what the next action should be.

I'm curious what your fault codes are, send them to me so I can let you know what steps I would take next. Maybe we can get to the bottom of your issue so your automotive stress is minimized AND maybe you'll even keep your Porsche, because the 993 is one of the best Porsche's ever built!

Random Engine Hesitation - 1984 944

Question: First, thank you for all your help with the previous questions answered on similar engine situations. Here is the problem. The 944 engine hesitates about once a month. It is my daily driver. When the hesitation begins, I have noticed the occurrence during the morning, at acceleration from a standstill and continues for about 20-30 seconds. The engine is unable to move beyond 2200-2600 RPMS. The hesitation eventually disappears and driving resumes to normal until another month from now. I do have a Porsche mechanic and he has done the following:

1. Complete tune up (all plugs, hoses looked good or were replaced). 2. Replaced ENTIRE fuel system (fuel pump, filter, hoses, etc). 3. New oxygen sensor. 4. Replaced DME. 5. Cleaned TPS. The fuel used is always the same brand and quality.

Are there any other areas that should be checked?

Answer: Submitted by George Beuselin. The issue here is less that you have a problem, but more that you have an intermittent problem. It is the randomness of the problem that is making the diagnosis difficult. If you cannot diagnose the problem while it is happening, you are left to throwing parts at the problem, which process you have already begun.

There seems to be two parts which you have not yet thrown at the problem: First, the Air Flow Meter, which can, over time, develop a wear pattern on the circuit board inside the meter, causing flat spots, which sounds a little bit like your problem the AFM, however doesn't explain why it only happens once a month in the morning. That said, it's worth a look. The second part is the DME/ECU itself. The ECU (I'll call it that despite its official name as DME (to avoid confusion with the DME relay)) contains 99 percent of the electronics to make the 944 function. It could be that there is an intermittent cold solder joint or other problem that is causing your problem.

My advice to you at this point is to find a PCA friend who has the same early 944 (1983 to 1985/1) as you do, and swap the ECU from one car to another and run them for a while. If you continue to have the problem with his ECU in your car, then it wasn't the ECU. Swap them back and then do the same with the AFM. The swap procedure for either part takes about 10 minutes' max, and will not cause damage to your friend's car or your own.

With a lot of patience and a bit of luck, you can figure out what you will need to make your car as good as new.

Before all of our regions' driving seasons began, it was time for us to hold our annual Zone 4 Presidents' and DE Meetings. This year we were




