# Rolex 24 hours of Daytona

In July of 2011, Diane and I attended the Porsche Parade in Savannah, Georgia. One of the events that we decided to attend was the dinner sponsored by Adobe Rode Winery. A Wine tasting event and dinner, right up our alley! For those of you unfamiliar with Adobe Road Winery, it is owned and operated by Kevin Buckler, who happens to be a former race car driver, overall winner of the Rolex 24 hour race, and is also owner of TRG racing. TRG (The Racers Group) is a professional race operation and motor sports marketing company.

While in Savannah I had some "car issues." Diane and I had stayed out at the campground and we had problems with the 930 Turbo. We could not get a hold of any dealers and decided to

call Tom. We were hoping that since Tom had connections everywhere he could help us out. Tom Isley handed the phone over to Martin Steger. Martin talked me through a few ideas and even volunteered to come out to the campground and take a look at what was going on with the car. I was actually able to figure out the problem with the 930, but not before finding out that Martin, as it turns out, is Club Racing Director for TRG and also worked at the Porsche factory for the time period that our car was made there in Germany.

That evening at dinner, Tom introduced Diane and myself to Martin. We got to talking about the upcoming Rolex 24 hour race at Daytona and I mentioned that I already had plans to

attend and even had my room at our timeshare reserved. Martin talked about how they utilize volunteers to help out during the race and before I knew what was happening Diane had me volunteered to work! Martin gave me a business card and said to get a hold of him in January, 2012.

Well, this past January I did precisely that. I emailed Martin in early January and was invited to be a volunteer for the pit crew for TRG Racing for the 50th Anniversary Rolex 24 Hour Race at Daytona! So, I left Diane at home (she knew I'd be busy) and started driving to Daytona on Wednesday, January 25th, destination: Daytona. I was quite excited as I drove, unsure of exactly what it was that I would get to do. Turns out, a lot!

I was told to contact Greg Jones. Thursday I familiarized myself with the track while I awaited Greg's call. Greg called, and I was told to report at the track to get my credentials before 7am Friday. I was there bright and early, credentials in hand, ready to work.

First they had me checking the compressed air tanks, then I got to place decals on tool boxes and then we set up the pit area by placing banners and what not. I termed myself "pit-b...." Then the real work began!

TRG racing had 5GT cars running this Historic Race. It was surreal to be here in this capacity. They ran cars #64, 65, 66, 67 and #68. I was working mostly on car #68. We worked diligently to prepare the pits for the race. And before you knew it Saturday, January 28th, Race Day had arrived.

I started out by doing air gun checks and making sure tools were functional and ready and before I knew it, I found myself in charge of the "fire-extinguisher". Doesn't sound like much, but I was in head-to-toe fire retardant gear. I had to stand behind the "dead-man" (who is the gas fueler)

with extinguisher in hand, ready to extinguish any flames. Diane wasn't necessarily as excited as me, but, Todd reassured her that life-insurance was up to date. If you DVR'd the event, that is me at 20:56 minutes into the event standing behind the fueler at car #68. Yes, I know I was seen more on National TV because Speed Channel was camped out in front of us, but to tell the truth, I haven't even gotten to watch the whole race yet.

It turned out that I was up for 36 hours straight, not even a wink of sleep. We stayed busy all through the night watching over the racers, making sure they were safe. Several calls home made to Diane and also during the Porsche Planning meeting kept me in reality, because this was something I could've only dreamed to get to do! Even though it was extremely busy the

entire time, sleep deprivation and all, it was one of the most amazing things I have ever gotten to do. But the most amazing part was that I was a on the team that brought car #68 from the 44th position to coming in 24th position in GT class, only due to having to go back to garage twice for repairs. The overall win though was #67 car that started in 39th position and came in 2nd place for GT Class, earning TRG Racers Team a Podium Spot for the 50th Anniversary Race at the Rolex 24 at Daytona. If you Google TRG you will see their amazing race history with Grand Am. This team has had the most victories in Rolex Series history.

Given the opportunity, I will be there again, in a heart beat!

# Early History of MVR

The Toledo area was fairly active in motorsports by 1972, with several sports, car clubs operating for many years. With the exception of two Corvette clubs, these area clubs catered to anyone, regardless of what type of car was driven. That was the way it was for over a decade.

Early in March of 1972, many area Porsche owners received a letter from two individuals interested in starting a Porsche club; namely, Roger Holliday, already a PCA member and cofounder of the Porsche Club of Great Britain, and Lynn Mesnard, enthusiast and Porsche owner. The letter stated that, due to the ever increasing number or Porsches in the area, a Porsche club was going to be started, and an organizational meeting would be held on March 12, 1972 at the Porsche dealer, Will Dennis, Inc. Everyone was invited to attend and give their ideas for club functions. The showroom was filled with interested Porsche owners, and at this first meeting, a slate of officers was elected, consisting of the following: President, Roger Holliday; Vice-President, Bruce Tucker, Secre-

tary; Lynn Mesnard; Treasurer, Bill Straley.

It was found that there were two persons present who were already members of PCA, namely, Dick Kruppa, then a member of the Mid-Ohio region and a member since 1966, and Bill Bauman, who had Joined the Southeastern Michigan region in 1971.

The new officers and a few other enthusiastic Porsche owners gathered at the home of Lynn and Cheri Mesnard later to plan the course for the new club. Committee chair people were appointed and plans were made for some activities. Activities Chairman was Dick Kruppa and membership Chairman was Hans Friedebach. A name was chosen for the club - the Maumee Valley Region of the Porsche Club of America - thus making the fourth region of PCA in Ohio. The name chosen for the newsletter was "Der Rückspiegel," which means "rear view mirror" in German

The regional boundaries desired for the Maumee Valley Region were selected and plans were made to contact the other existing neighboring regions, requesting them to relinquish the counties that were planned to make up the new region. The selection of these counties was made by studying the marketing trends of the area and the result was that Toledo was the business center for the neighboring Michigan counties and also the main center of interest for Porsche owners.

The first MVR activity was a fun rally on April 23. 1972, which ended with a smorgasbord dinner in Port Clinton, Ohio. After dinner, a brief meeting was held at which Dick Kruppa was selected President to replace Roger

Holliday, since Roger's company had assigned him to Europe for several years. Bill Bauman and Chuck Mekbel were appointed Activities Co-Chairmen to replace Dick.

The first MVR newsletter came out in May 1972. Since the region had no editor yet, this was a brief summary of past and future plans for the club, edited as a joint effort by the officers.

In May, two more chair people were appointed: Jim Rawlins became Technical Chairman, and Becky Nowak volunteered to be Newsletter Editor.

In June of 1972, The Maumee Valley Region became officially chartered in the Porsche Club of America, 45 members strong. The charter was presented at the Oktoberfest '72 in Columbus.

MVR was active every month in 1972, hosting a tech session, a dinner meeting with a neighboring region, another rally, several autocrosses, a caravan and picnic, and a tour to the Can Am races at the Mid Ohio race track, as well as attending other region's events, such as the Oktoberfest weekend, two autocrosses at Indianapolis Raceway Park (IRP), and one member went to the National Parade at Lake Geneva, Wisconsin.

New members were added almost every month and after only nine months in existence, MVR had grown to sixty-eight members by December of 1972.

# The new Boxster (981)

January 12, 2012—Porsche has released the first photos of the long awaited next generation Boxster. Touted as the most comprehensive generational change in the midengined roadster's history, the Type 981 Boxster has a longer wheelbase and a wider track, is lighter, more fuel efficient and has electromechanical steering. Sound like something else you just read about? No surprise, the 981 has incorporated many of the technical and some of the styling features of the 991, the "new 911." In addition to a new lightweight body, the Boxster chassis is said to have been completely revamped. There has been a redesign of the top, which now folds into place as its own cover in the fashion of the 911 cabriolet. Inside the more spacious interior there is a continuation of the Carrera GT risingconsole theme. The harder core elements of the Boxster's evolution include changes in engine displacement for the basic model, which is reduced

to 2.7 liters, but with added direct injection and a ten horsepower increase in output at 265 hp. The S, with displacement unchanged at 3.4 liters, gets five more horses for a total of 315. Both deliver their power through either the standard six-speed manual or the seven-speed PDK, the latter producing both the best acceleration and economy by Porsche's testing. Zero to 60 times of 5.4 and 4.7 are claimed for the Boxster and the S respectively. Again taking a page from the 991's engineering sheet, "dynamic transmission mounts"-using technology similar to the magnetic engine mounts in the GT3 and 991—are now part of the optional Sport Chrono package, and torque vectoring with mechanical rear axle differential lock is a Boxster option for the first time. Expected to be in dealer's hands early this summer, base prices have increased to \$49,500 for the Boxster and \$60,900 for the Boxster S.




