



Technical Q and A

Wheels and Tires

Question: I am about to buy a '13 Boxster S with PASM and I can get it either with 19 or 20 inch wheels. I really like the look of the 20" wheels but I am worried that they won't drive comfortably and will be noisy. I am also worried that they won't hold up at the occasional track day or autocross events. Any thoughts or recommendations? Should I play it safe with the 19s (which still look good)?

Answer: Submitted by Pedro Bonilla. Porsche did a fantastic job with the suspension in these cars. I too was a bit skeptical of 20" wheels especially at the track, but as a HPDE instructor I get the opportunity to compare all sorts of combinations and setups and can tell you that the 20" with PASM work very well. They are more expensive than 19s but if you like the look and don't mind the cost, go for it!

Wheels and Tires - 2014 911 Carrera S

Question: Car is my daily driver. Current tires are OEM Pirelli P Zeros. At 45 degrees or lower, it's like driving on hockey pucks. I'm looking for a tire that will better adapt to cold weather, willing to sacrifice performance.

Answer: Submitted by Dustin Aydt. If you are truly willing to sacrifice dry performance you should look into a set of winter tires. Being your car is equipped with 20" wheels from the factory there are limited options available to you. One option to consider which is a Porsche approved N-rated tire is the Pirelli Winter Sottozero Series II. Unfortunately, there are not a lot of all-season options for your vehicle's required tire size as all-seasons would be a good compromise. Best case scenario is to invest in a separate set of "winter wheels" with the Sottozeros mounted and swap back and forth as the seasons demand. Changing over to 19" wheels opens up your tire selection greatly. For tire information I highly recommend using the Tire Rack website as they are the factory supplier for Porsche dealers in the US.

1987 944S Temperature Gauge / Cruise Control Acceleration

Question: I sent gauge cluster off for odometer repair When I reinstalled the temp gauge keeps climbing but car doesn't seem to be overhearing and fans run. What do you think??

Also the cruise control when set just keeps on accelerating This also problem before odometer was repaired. It had been working fine and just started acting up Again what do you think??

Answer: Submitted by George Beuselin. The temp gauge on your car is a function of the temp senfrt and the gauge itself. You can test the sender in a pan of hot water with an ohmmeter. If that is in spec, then the gauge is bad, but check the connections at the back of the gauge cluster first.

The sender resistance readings for late 944s (1985.5 and Newer) are as follows:

Temperature (°C) - Resistance (Ohms)

40 - 287.4

60 - 134.0

80 - 69.1

100 - 38.5

115 - 25.8

As far as the cruise control continuing to accelerate, this is a common problem with the cruise control box, you can locate it by looking straight up from the clutch pedal on the inner fender. There are two connectors and two 10 mm nuts for the physical attachment. It might be easier to manipulate if you take out the driver seat first.

1975 914 1.8

Question: The 1.8-liter engine will not rev up when cold. Once the engine is warm it does rev up. It will only idle when cold it will not rev up, once warm it does run fairly well.

Answer: Submitted by Edward Mayo. There are a lot of possibilities here, some more obvious than others, I'll try to give you the more common ones. Since you say it runs fine when warm we might be able to assume for now that the ignition part is okay. You don't say how long you've had this car, or if it has ever run good cold since your ownership, or if this was a sudden problem or a slow degradation over a period of time, all important in diagnosing problems. An engine needs to have a richer fuel mixture to run well when cold, since that is when yours runs badly let's say that this may be the problem. First make sure the oring in the oil filler cap is good, secondly, pull off the air boot from the air flap housing and ensure that the flap moves absolutely freely. Check the air boot for cracks, brittle vacuum hoses, these engines do not tolerate any vacuum leaks. And last, you'll need to check the resistance of the cylinder head temp sensor. The sensor is screwed into the head by #3 cylinder, you'll see a black wire coming from the cylinder head sheet metal cover, this plugs into a plastic spade connector, disconnect the black wire, and using an ohm meter check the resistance of the sensor to ground, it should be around 2,000 to 3,000 ohms depending on what the cold temperature of the head is. This resistance is what sends a signal to the computer that the engine is cold and needs a richer mixture. As the engine warms up the resistance will drop, to about 30 to 40 ohms. Hopefully after checking out these possibilities you'll find something.




