

Technical Q and A

Blaupunkt Radio Repair - 1984 944

Question: I have a 1984 944 with the original Blaupunkt radio. Where can I get it repaired or where can I get the same radio or a radio that was original to the car?

Answer: Submitted by George Beuselin. I did a google search on Blaupunkt Radio Repair and found two shops, one in Eastern Pennsylvania and one in New York City. You should do the google search yourself and check them out.

As far as finding a replacement radio of the same kind, check with Porsche dismantlers, or begin your search of Ebay. In either case, prepare to find that even a perfectly operating 30-year-old radio is going to perform like a 30 year old radio. Radio technology has progressed quite a bit in the meantime.

Serpentine Belt Replacement - 2013 Boxster S

Question: Trying to replace my belt and it was going easy until I realized there is an engine brace bolt/spacer on the left side of the engine that needs to be removed for the belt to come out. I was able to get the bolt out, however, I'm afraid to unscrew the spacer because as it's being turned, it's pushing the brace away from the motor and I'm not sure how far it has to go. I'm afraid I'm going to end up snapping the aluminum brace. I unscrewed the spacer about 1.5mm before I chickened out and put everything back together.

Do I need to take all the brace bolts out and remove the brace or will this spacer come out if I just keep going a little bit more? I did loosen the brace bolt on the right side a bit but I'm still concerned about breaking this brace. Without this bolt/spacer, this could have been a 15-minute job!

Answer: Submitted by Pedro Bonilla. You only need to remove the upper left bolt assembly and not the entire engine bracket. First remove the M10x40 hex bolt which torques to 37 ft. lb. It goes through the engine bracket then through a spacer sleeve which is about 3/8" thick and threads into a spacer bolt. The spacer bolt is about 2" long and has a hex surface on the side of it to torque it into the engine block at 48 ft. lb. The spacer sleeve gives you room to unthread the spacer bolt from the engine block. The spacer bolt has male threads to go into the engine block and female threads to receive the hex bolt and a hex surface to tighten it into the block.

Revs - 2012 Boxster S

Question: I used to drive my 1987 3.2L Targa very briskly, and never had any engine problems. Can I drive my new 2012 Boxster S in the same fashion? Has the 9A1 engine proven to be robust? Thank you.

Answer: Submitted by Pedro Bonilla. Fact: Porsches that get driven often and hard have less issues that those that spend their days in a garage waiting to be taken out on a sporadic Sunday for a leisurely drive.

Maintenance Recommendations - 1983 944

Question: I have a 1983 944 that I have owned since new. It is about to turn over 50,000 miles. I have done the normal maintenance on my car and the timing/balance shaft belts/water pump have been replaced at 37,342 miles on September 16, 2004. Is there any major maintenance would you suggest now? It still has the original clutch. Would you consider the timing/balance shaft belts to still be OK? Thanks for your help!

Answer: Submitted by George Beuselin. So, your timing belt is 13 years old? Time for its Bar Mitzvah! Today it is a man!

I would recommend replacing the timing belt, the balance shaft belt, the pulleys and all the rubber parts under the hood. I also recommend replacing all the fluids in the 35-year-old car, especially flushing the brake and clutch hydraulics. I would not replace the clutch if it is still giving good service.

Window Clearance Hitting the Roof - 2003 Boxster S

Question: When inside the car I go to open my driver's side door the window drops a small amount but not enough to clear the convertible top. I manually lower the window to open the door. If I attempt to open the convertible top when the windows are fully closed, generally the window drops before the roof opens. This operation no longer works. Also, when I want to enter the car and lift the door handle the window drops 1/4 inch but not enough to clear the roof. Looking to know what the issue might be and an estimate of what this might cost me to repair. Thank you, SG

Answer: Submitted by Pedro Bonilla. Most likely the problem is with the window regulator. This is a very common occurrence on older Porsches. The regulator is about \$150 plus 1-hour labor.
