

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#### **MVR - DID YOU KNOW?**

#### March 30, 2019

While we here in Northwest Ohio are courageously bearing the cold spring rains, in hopes of a bloom-filled early summer, it is only dark, heavy tears that are falling in Brazil and Germany these past few weeks.

In mid March, the Grande America – a cargo ship owned and operated by the Italian firm, The Grimaldi Group, was transporting cargo from Hamburg, Germany to Santos, Brazil. Tragedy struck early in its voyage when a fire - a transformative fire—erupted in one of its shipping containers. With valiant, though unrewarded effort the crew could not contain the flames. The ship began to list, ultimately capsizing and sinking just one day later in nearly 15,000 feet of water, 200 miles off the coast of Brest, France.



Why, you ask, would this seemingly small disaster cause heavy tears in two separate countries? The treasure this ship was carrying: 2,000 new Audis, 33 new Porsches, and ( sigh! ) four new Porsche 911 GT2 RSs. You may

Thankfully, the 27 crew were rescued without injury. However, these magnificent cars met a much more diabolical fate, that of one of Shakespeare's most notorious tragedies. The destiny of these four 700-horsepower, turbo charged flatsix engines - indeed masterpieces of engineering and driving devotion - is now to forever inhabit the depths of the unforgiving Atlantic. And like the great Shakespeare, who is a master at adding further insult to already mortal injury, Porsche had formally concluded its GT2 RS production line in February, 2019. After closing the line, there seemed no possibility of opening it back up...



"Porsche Brasil confirms that 37 of its new cars, in route from Hamburg, Germany, to Santos, Brazil, were aboard the vessel Grande America that suffered a maritime incident near the coast of Brest, France, on March 12, 2019. Among the fleet were four 911 GT2 RS units. In a special decision and to uphold its commitment to its valued Brazilian customers, Porsche has ensured that those units will be reproduced in the order in which they were originally confirmed."

Porsche is planning to re-open the GT2 RS line some time in April, with an early summer delivery scheduled. The four Brazilian customers who paid at least \$292,200 each, will not see their beloved cars only at the bottom of a very deep, watery grave. So, we breathe a bit easier and wipe away heavy tears, as this tragic play winds toward a most fortunate conclusion. Shakespeare be damned!

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#### **TECHNICAL Q&A**

#### Weber Carburetor - 1967 911S

**Question:** Does turning in (clockwise) the ideal mixture screw make the car run richer or leaner. Cylinder number 3 is running too lean as the spark plug is a light orange color almost light rust color while all the others are a light gray with very little dry soot.

**Answer:** Submitted by Edward Mayo. Turning the mixture screw clockwise threads it further into the passage, thus closing it off and decreasing the fuel air mixture to that cylinder. With the engine running and warmed up you should be able to back out the screw (ccw) and hear the engine speed pick up if indeed that mixture screw was turned in too far. More than likely, if that doesn't work, you have a partial clogged idle jet. Remove the idle jet carrier and remove the jet insert and blow thru it to make sure it is clear. Now with the engine running you should be able to turn the mixture screw slowly cw. shutting off the fuel/air supply, then slowly back out the mixture screw until you hear the engine pick up speed as that cylinder gets the proper fuel/air mixture again.

#### Rough Idle - 1989 944 \$2

**Question:** Heavily serviced all original 944 S2. I would like to see if there is a way to make the engine run smoother. The car has new timing belts, plugs, rebuilt CPU, 02 sensor, no vacuum leaks, fuel injectors cleaned and checked for flow, fuel pump is strong, etc. I am hearing that this is a native issue to the 3.0 motor configuration and CPU but must believe there is a way to make the car behave a little more modern from an idle perspective.

**Answer:** Submitted by George Beuselin. The 3.0-liter engine in your car is the largest 4 cylinder I am aware of. There are inherent imbalances in the engine which have been mitigated by the balance shafts and the rubber center harmonic balancer as well as the motor mounts. If all the above are in perfect condition (you should check them), the other factor which keeps this engine from being as smooth as a modern 2019 engine is that it was designed over 30 years ago. Nothing you do will make this a 2019 engine.

Enjoy the vagaries of owning a car that is older than most of the drivers around you. It's part of the charm, not a problem.

#### Tires - 2014 Cayman

**Question:** I've spent a fair amount of time surfing the web researching tires for my 2014 Cayman, and I haven't yet settled on a tire strategy to keep it drivable year-round. My first thought was a dedicated set of cold weather wheels with different tires (running the summer only Pirellis on S 19in wheels currently), but then figured it'd be simpler to just swap winter rubber onto the wheels I have. That would require Porsche approved tires as I bought 5 years of wheel coverage with the car, which narrows the options considerably. Also, I've yet to find any such tires of the all-season variety even though many current all-season tires have enough traction for all but the most spirited street driving. So, my question is this- what is the ideal tire solution for year-round driving for this car? Thanks in advance for your time- it is much appreciated.

**Answer:** Submitted by Pedro Bonilla. I think your first idea is the one I'd use. It's not practical to mount and unmount tires twice per year on your wheels. Every time you mount, you'll also have to balance as well. I'd purchase an inexpensive set of 17" wheels and install winter tires on them. 17s will also be cheaper than 19s.

#### Installation of Porsche Replacement Radio - 1988 911 Carrera

**Question:** I am planning on installing a Porsche replacement sat-nav radio (part no. 91164529100) in my 1988 Carrera. Everything I've read indicates the new unit will fit right into the existing space. The service department of a local Porsche dealership suggested that the radio should be a simple installation, "just plug and play". Since the replacement has features that didn't exist in 1988, I doubt the installation will be as simple as suggested. The car currently has an after-market system installed by the previous owner. Are there other parts that I will need to complete the installation? Is this a job for radio expert? Thanks.

**Answer:** Submitted by Chris Powell. We have installed several of these in our shop and replacing an original radio with this one is indeed simple. Running the antenna wires is the hardest part. However, since there is an aftermarket stereo, many things could have changed, including speaker wire connections, power connections, and the dash mount. You might go ahead and start but have a backup radio installer in case it is too complicated.

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#### **The Story of Rennstatt**

For those of you who speak even a little German you know that Rennstatt means "Race Shop". While we do in fact prepare many cars for the track, our core business is maintaining and repairing our beloved Porsches that are driven on the street.

Rennstatt is the performance division of ArborMotion which is a Bosch Certified premier import auto repair center in Ann Arbor, MI. Residing inside ArborMotion, but separate from the main shop, Rennstatt is a 2,500 square foot dedicated shop with 4 hoists and two fully qualified Porsche technicians. Typical jobs for us are IMS bearing upgrades, street and performance alignments, scheduled maintenance, brakes & suspension and engine performance diagnosis & repair. As a fully equipped Porsche repair shop, we use the factory PIWIS software and old school scopes & testers for Porsche vehicles from 356 to current models to diagnose any issues.

Our roots began in 1978 when Tim Pott opened his first shop repairing Porsche vehicles. Fast forward 41 years and ArborMotion and Rennstatt are now owned by 25 year PCA member Sebastian Gaeta who has been in the auto repair industry for nearly 30 years. Rennstatt is managed by Nick Pott (Tim's son) who literally grew up around Porsche repair and track days, so it's in our blood to say the least.

Lastly, we fully believe that Porsche ownership should be fun. On the second Saturday of each month from 9am to 11am we host The Gathering, a causal social get-together with other Porsche owners to gaze at the cars being serviced and enjoy coffee and bagels. In good weather the parking lot is full of our favorite cars so people can gather outside to see what everyone drove. 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




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
