# **Technical Talk**

PPI. Great . That's just what we need. More acronyms. In addition to CPO (Certified Pre-Owned), ABS (Anti-lock Brake System), and TPMS (Tire Pressure Monitoring System), now we have PPI or Pre-Purchase Inspection.

Since there's been a real shortage of crystal balls in recent years, when considering the purchase of a previously-enjoyed car, a PPI is not an option. Contact a trusted repair shop that specializes in the marque you're considering. Seeking out a professional opinion on a prospective addition to your fleet can help you avoid an unpleasant discovery after the deal is done, and deter what we really fear most – the dreaded wallet cashectomy.

A small expenditure beforehand can save you thousands later. The extent of the examination can vary. A basic once-over inspection can suffice for a car with a complete maintenance history or if the shop performing the PPI happens to be familiar with that particular car. Otherwise, an unknown car with few records would need to be looked at more closely.

Tony Callas, the owner of Callas Rennsport in Torrance, California, allows 4 to 6 hours for a thorough PPI, with the thought in mind that should a major problem be discovered in the first hour or so, the inspection would end. There's not much point in doing a compression test, let's say, if the engine is knocking and rapping like Jay-Z.

To follow Tony Callas' recipe, a chassis inspection heads the list, followed by the drive train, engine, gearbox, brake sys-

tem, and condition of the interior. Beginning with newer cars - 1989 and up - electronics play an important part in the evaluation. Ten years later - starting with the 996 – the car's "brain" or DME (Digital Motor Electronics) can even record the number of engine over-revs. The 997 breaks down this data even further so it's possible to see if the previous owner thought that bouncing off the rev limiter just meant it was time to shift.

As pricey as Porsches have become, it's surprising how many are treated roughly with little attention to service and virtually no maintenance. A good PPI and extensive records can help to dismiss these cars

as unworthy candidates. Meanwhile, the previous owner of that highly sought after cream puff may have actually written down every time he got gas or aired the tires. Perhaps a bit AR (anal retentive), but better TMI (too much information) than winding up SOL.
